

Dr. Grace Miller, Indiana Wesleyan University, IN

Dr. Grace Miller is a Professor of Biology at Indiana Wesleyan University. Garth, Grace and their children, Zea and Noah, spent 2 years in Morocco, where they taught at an orphanage before moving to Indiana in the fall of 2009. Grace was the Seed Bank Director at ECHO (Agricultural Missions Organization, Ft. Myers, FL) for 4 years. She taught Biology at Gordon College (1991-2001), and directs a course called Sustainable Tropical Agriculture at ECHO and Guatemala, Haiti or Honduras. She teaches Marine Biology and has taken students snorkeling in Belize, Venezuela, Kenya and Malaysia. Grace has a BA in Art and Botany from Duke University, a MS in Agronomy from UC Davis and a Ph.D. from Purdue University. She has been conducting research on the Moringa plant in her lab for 10 years. She was born in Manila and her parents are from China. She studied Mandarin, and Chinese painting and music in Taiwan for two years. She worked as a Park Ranger after college at Cape Lookout National Seashore. She has taught classes in Plant Biology, Environment and Society, Ecology, Marine Ecology, and Crops and Society.
